

The Lady Barbrova from Ken Hamer's Testimony

We were then hidden in somebody's - and this is a memory I have specifically. I don't know how we got this...the lady's name was Barbrova. I don't know what her surname was. She had a large cellar under her lounge room or dining room in which there was a large, again, cupboard on top of it. And when the cupboard was shifted you could go down there and we were down there, but there was a space, a gap and somehow, obviously, we were denounced and some soldiers or Germans came in and one of the guys with us in actual fact had a grenade and I remember him pulling the pin on the grenade and I then, I presume I fainted because next thing is I woke some time later and we had to leave from there because she wasn't taking any more risks. Somehow the German didn't see this space under the cupboard, the sun got in his eyes or whatever it was, and left, and that night we had to go out and again lived in the forests for some time.
