

## From the Testimony of Don Krausz about the Death of his Family, 1944

Almost a year and a half...we watched our friends come and go, we watched our families come and go because many members of my family had lost their Hungarian citizenship and had become naturalized Dutch and there was nothing that could be done for them. They would come, two, three weeks later they were gone. And that is how I lost twenty-three members of my father's family, which was virtually almost every uncle, every aunt, every cousin, every friend. In February, 1944, all the Hungarian Jews that were in Holland were sent to Germany. My father and three of his brothers were sent to Buchenwald. Sixty thousand people died in Buchenwald. Of the four of them, only one brother came back. From what that one brother told me, my father was practically beaten to death there.
