

From the Testimony of Don Krausz about the Implementation of the Nuremberg Laws, Rotterdam The Netherlands, 1941

In 1941, the Nuremberg laws were being implemented. We had to wear the yellow star. I was taken out of my school. I had been in that school for about six years. We were put into a special Jewish school which, under the circumstances, with teachers disappearing every day just about, pupils disappearing - was not really a school. There was too much tension. We were not allowed to go to the cinema, we couldn't have bicycles, we couldn't go to a playground. As a child, you could not go to a playground. And there were all kinds of laws like that.
